TIPS AND ADVICE - AUDIO

- Turn off all other notifications on your computer or phone
- Work from a quiet space free from distractions
- Do a test video, replay, and ensure you can hear your voice clearly
- If you can, work in a carpeted room
- Speak slower than you might do in person





TIPS AND ADVICE - VIDEO



- Your camera is best at, or just above eye level
- Try to look into your camera to make eye contact with your audience
- Check how your screen setup looks from a viewers' perspective and make changes ahead of recording
- Don't use competing light sources. A couple of LED lights are a great way to light your face
- Sit facing a light source (e.g. window) not with it behind you. Use natural light if you can
- Try standing whilst presenting
- Use the conference virtual background if you are concerned about disruptions or privacy



RECORD USING ZOOM

- We strongly recommend recording your talk on Zoom
- You should prepare your PowerPoint presentation in 16:9 widescreen aspect ratio
- Zoom lets you record your shared slides while recording a video of you presenting alongside them
- Zoom is free to use. If you don't already have an account, you can easily create one by heading to their website and clicking the 'Sign up it's free' button
- Once your account is set up, in the top right corner select 'Host a Meeting' and choose 'With Video On'







RECORD USING ZOOM

- Please watch your recording before submitting to make sure you are happy with it. You will only be able to submit once

RECORD USING POWERPOINT

- If you can't use Zoom, PowerPoint allows you to record your slideshow
- If you have Office 365 and an integrated camera, you can record video and audio. Otherwise, you will only be able to record audio

ACCESSIBILITY



The British Ecological Society wants to ensure that the online Festival of Ecology is as inclusive as possible.

We have put together the following checklist for your pre-recorded video presentation and/or ePoster.



ACCESSIBILITY

- Use simple, sans-serif fonts e.g. Arial, Verdana, Helvetica
- Use large font sizes: size 24 minimum for slides, 9 for PDF posters
- Avoid all-caps and instead use bold for emphasis
- Use contrasting colours for background and text
- Check that your <u>figures are suitable</u> for colour-blind viewers
- Keep animations simple and do not use flashing GIFs





ACCESSIBILITY



- Spell out abbreviations and acronyms when first used
- Speak slowly and clearly; if possible, ensure that your face can be seen clearly whilst you are speaking
- Ensure you verbally talk about all displayed text and graphics do not assume they can be read/seen
- Check your PDF poster has searchable text (Microsoft Word automatically generates searchable PDFs alternatively use the <u>Adobe function</u>).



CLOSED CAPTIONS & SUBTITLES

We encourage closed captions or subtitles to be added to your videos.

Option 1

The conference platform links out to Vimeo or YouTube. If you have your own accounts with these providers, you can upload your talk, add closed captions, and insert this video link when you submit your talk.

Option 2

You can 'burn' subtitles to your video, these are visible on screen all the time. As well as software like <u>VLC</u>, there are several online tools that can be used.
